St. Paul famously said, “I am well content with weaknesses ... for Christ’s sake; for when I am weak, then I am strong.” So, we’re in good company.

In a world that increasingly celebrates might and wealth, The Anchorage offers spiritual shelter for those who are weak and who know it. We believe the ancient word:

For instance, our Depth Soundings quarterly goes into a maximum security prison, people with extensive medical needs join us to listen for God’s word together, and others without recourse are finding God at The Anchorage – with space, direction and community given regardless of ability to pay.

This is where you and I come in. By giving to The Anchorage, we can be the strong, extended arms of God to those who are weak and who seek strength and shelter in God.
