We have Celebrated God this entire 20th year of The Anchorage and it has been a joy. It seemed important that our May 4-6 retreat theme (see p. 3 right column) be what The Anchorage is all about - a mutual love relationship with God. Every event we offer has time for the retreatant, for you, to be in solitude with God for reflection, to let God love you and give you a chance to love God in return.

God seems to long for this mutual love relationship even more than we do, and offers it, to everyone. It is not equal because God is God, but it is mutual. It is the main point of the last discourse of Jesus in John's Gospel culminating in the prayer of John 17. When we love God back; when we return God's love, we join the dance with the Trinity that then overflows to others in abundance.

This image has been central to The Anchorage since our beginning in May 1998 and was the main reason we sensed God's leading to become a place to "come away - anchor deep." The best part is that all are invited by God to the dance, to take part fully. At the top of the reflection page in the suggestions as retreatants begin their solitude time with God are these words, "Behold God beholding you in love." Many of you have commented that those words were enough for the entire retreat, indeed for a year or more. And what's so great - is that it is true at each moment. All gift.

So "Make Your Home in My Love: Invitation to Intimacy" is our theme for our retreat. (See full paraphrase of the passage from The Message on the back.) Over the next 20 years, or more, we will be even more intentional to invite all to this journey deep into God's love, as God leads.

God knows you and loves you; I hope that undoes you!

"A Silent Retreat at the Jesuit Center in Wernersville, PA in 2013" By Molly Wilkes

My first introduction to The Anchorage was in 2003. Since then I have been blessed to experience many opportunities through this ministry for spiritual growth, inspiration and practicing the presence of God.

One unique experience was a trip to the Jesuit Spirituality Center in Wernersville, PA, for a 7-day silent retreat with Catherine as my Spiritual Director. I had gone to Mepkin for a 3-day silent retreat, but this would be more intense. I felt drawn to get away from worldly distractions and cultural pressure and to hear a fresh word from God.

It was in March and snowing in Pennsylvania. I went alone for a nine-hour drive going to an unknown place for an unknown journey. This all served the purpose of surrendering to the providence and care of God, trusting God in it all. What I knew for sure was that God is faithful and I felt God's pleasure in giving this time to grow deeper in my spiritual life and listen to what God had for me. I felt I was moving into a desert place where Jesus would be my constant companion.

I never felt the silence was awkward. It took me away from the expectation to be anything but in communion with this One who was always with me. It was a beautiful setting to feel safe to journey with other souls who were also experiencing the quiet and stillness with a similar desire to surrender to God's will.

We had Mass everyday where we worshiped and sang together. Also, individual spiritual direction daily where there was inner reflection and Ignatian imagery to let the Spirit guide us to what God was saying through the Scripture for our own life. I was invite by Catherine to pray for a grace each day to know how much I was loved. As I walked around the beautiful grounds I sang to God as my soul poured out gratitude and I felt deep peace. I learned again about the tenderness of God, knowing there is nothing to fear in this relationship, rather there is joy and aliveness in God.

What the experience meant for me was a time to focus on Being rather than Doing, helping me to open my heart more fully to God's grace and to be more responsive to loving guidance. The words of Thomas a Kempis became mine, "I do not ask for gifts, but for Thyself."

The hospitality and warmth of the Center gave me a feeling of safety and space to explore my own intimacy with God. The Spiritual direction opened me up to Scripture in a life giving way, passing other pilgrims in the hallways, not speaking but knowing we journey together, made me feel even more deeply connected to God and to others. All in all, it was a gift that I will always remember that renewed my heart and refreshed my spirit. The big question I took home for me to ponder was, "How can i best express my love for Christ?"
